

Auguste Adler, née Weil
Deported to Theresienstadt in 1942

Auguste was born in Rexingen on November 20th 1876. Her parents were Sophie Löwenstein and the cattle-dealer Moritz Weil. She lived in what is today 11 Freudenstädter Strasse and was the eldest of five siblings all of whom had violent deaths. Her two brothers, Alfred and Salomon, were killed in World War I.

Auguste Weil married Moses Adler from Edelfingen. In 1929

- probably after the death of her husband - she moved back to Rexingen where her mother was still living. Auguste's sister Hedwig was deported to Riga in 1941 together with Hedwig's husband Adolf Sinn. Her second sister Zilly and Zilly's husband, Wilhelm Wälder, were deported to Theresienstadt with Auguste. Zilly died there in 1943.

The date of Auguste Adler's death is unknown. According to Zilly's obituary, in which the names of relatives in Theresienstadt were listed, Auguste was no longer alive in 1943.
