

Albert Pressburger **Deported to Theresienstadt in 1942.**

Albert was born in Rexingen on April 9th 1866. His parents were Josef Abraham Pressburger and Dorothea Hilb from Haigerloch. He married Gertrud Gideon from Rexingen who died in 1897 at the age of 23. The widower was left with two small children: Hilde, born in 1893, and Theodor, born in 1894. He got married again in Tübingen in November 1900, this time to Emma Hilb from Ulm. The couple lived in Horb where Albert Pressburger had set up a real estate business at his residence in 1905. In 1930 his second wife died. She is buried in the cemetery in Horb. In the

meantime his adult children from his first marriage were living in Ulm and Düsseldorf respectively. His daughter Hilde managed to flee to the USA with her husband, Max Ernst Salomon Kohn. His son Theodor died in Auschwitz in 1944.

In 1933 Albert Pressburger moved his real estate business to Stuttgart. Since he was under intensified surveillance by the tax authority, he gave up his business in 1936 and sold his property in Horb. In December 1938 his assets were confiscated. In October 1939 he moved to the Jewish home for the aged in 9 Heidehofstrasse, Stuttgart. In January 1941 all the residents of the home were forced to move to a home for the aged in Eschenau near Heilbronn. From there they were deported to Theresienstadt. Albert's brother Leopold and Leopold's wife Berta were part of the same transport.

Albert Pressburger died on October 2nd 1942. In his obituary blood-poisoning is quoted as the cause of death.
