

**Elsa Pressburger, née Neckarsulmer
Deported to Riga in 1941.**

Elsa was born in Rexingen on November 27th 1879. Her parents were Marie Stein from Mühlen and Isak Neckarsulmer. She had two siblings: Viktor, born in 1881, who died in Pforzheim in 1927 and Toni Lämmle née Neckarsulmer in Nördlingen, born in 1885,

Elsa Neckarsulmer married Heinrich Pressburger, a cattle-dealer from Rexingen. They lived in 220 Ihlinger Weg, today 26 Lichtenbergstrasse. On June 1st 1911 their son Alfons was born. Heinrich Pressburger was a lance corporal in World War I and was twice decorated. Their son Alfons worked as a cattle-dealer in Grafing near Munich. On April 8th 1933 he shot himself in his apartment when the police came to arrest him for “active dissemination of Jewish horror fairytales”. On the previous evening, in a discussion on the “Boycott of Jews” of April 1st, he had criticized the anti-Semitic measures taken by the Nazis. Heinrich Pressburger died on November 24th 1939 and is buried in the cemetery in Rexingen. His wife
