

Siegfried Stern

Deported to Theresienstadt in 1942.

Siegfried Stern was born in Horb on September 1st 1872. His parents were Regina Gideon from Mühlen and Lippmann Stern from Niederstetten, founder of Sterns' Clothing Factory. In 1898 Siegfried married Mina Leiter from Buttenwiesen. The marriage took place in Augsburg. Then Siegfried entered his father's firm.

Siegfried and Mina had five children: Sali, born in 1899; Karola, born in 1901; Johanna, born in 1902; Alice, born in 1904, and Fritz, born in 1912. The family lived in Neckarstrasse in Horb where Siegfried Stern ran his textile business.

His wife Mina died in 1923 and is buried in the Jewish cemetery in Horb. Sali, Karola and Fritz managed to flee to the USA. Alice married Viktor Esslinger, a merchant from Horb. In July 1941 Siegfried Stern, his daughter Alice, son-in-law Viktor, and grandson Helmut, were

forced to move to Rexingen since no Jews were allowed to remain in Horb. In December 1941 Alice, Viktor and their little son were deported to Riga. Alice's sister Johanna was

murdered in Kowno together with her daughter Ingeborg.

On September 26th 1942 Siegfried Stern was deported to Theresienstadt and then taken to Treblinka where he was murdered.
